## Dusk

Try creating this accessory using a pair of two-holed beads. One of them is the little used PRECIOSA Bow ${ }^{T M}$ bead which you can combine with the now standard PRECIOSA Candy Oval bead. Be inspired by the substantial effect of this bracelet in subdued tones.

## Materials and tools:

00030/98533 grey rainbow;
the bracelet: $28 x$, the pin: $4 x$
PRECIOSA Candy Oval
$11101388 ; 6 \times 8 \mathrm{~mm}$;
02010/01770 copper;
the bracelet: 7 x , the pin: $1 \mathrm{x}(\mathrm{C} 1)$
$11101388 ; 4 \times 6$ mm;
23980/15726 brown;
the bracelet: $56 x$, the pin: $8 x\left(C_{2}\right)$

the bracelet: 274x, the pin: 46 x (R1)

- a round spring fastening with eyes; 6 mm rings; a brooch pin with a sheath

- a 0.20 mm nylon line; a thin needle; scissors; flat nose pliers;
glue for non-absorbent materials

## Procedure:

## The bracelet

Sew a fragment made of $\mathbf{B}$ and $\mathbf{C}$.
Step 1:
String $1 \mathrm{x} \mathbf{C} 1,2 \mathrm{x} \mathbf{B}$ turned in relation to one another as a mirror image and $2 \mathrm{x} \mathrm{C}_{1}$ Thread the line through the second hole of the $2^{\text {nd }} \mathbf{B}$. String $1 \mathrm{x} \mathbf{C} 2,1 \mathrm{x} \mathbf{B}$ and $2 \mathrm{x} \mathbf{C} 1$ Thread the line through the second hole of the $3^{\text {rd }} \mathbf{B}$. String $1 \times \mathbf{B}$ and $2 \times \mathbf{C} 1$.
Thread the line through the second hole of the $4^{\text {th }} \mathbf{B}$, the second hole of the $\mathbf{C} 2$ and the second hole of the 1st B. String $1 \mathrm{x} \mathrm{C}_{1}$ at the end. Thread the line through everything one more time. Tie off the end of the line and pull it into the holes.


Step 2:
You need 7 such fragments.


Connect the fragments together into a bracelet.

## Step 3:

Sew through the second holes in the $\mathbf{C} 1$ and add $\mathbf{R}$. The outer arch consists of 12 R1. Add 2x R1 and 1x R2 on both sides of the fastening. Thread the line through an eye on the fastening. Thread $2 \times$ R1 into the gap between the $\mathbf{C}$. String $1 \mathrm{x} \mathbf{R} 1$ between the $\mathbf{C}_{1}$ from the neighbouring fragments. Sew together this R1 and the $\mathrm{R}_{1}$ in the gaps between the $\mathrm{C}_{1}$ and the $\mathbf{C} 1$ between them. Add 2x R1 when sewing above them.


Step 5:
Make a chain out of 8 x 6 mm rings. Decorate the last one with an R2. Connect them to an eye on the fastening.
